Journey Onward!

In the Cursillo movement they have a word for the journey into the future—"Ultreya!" Or—"Onward!" This comes out of knowing the Lord wants us to journey onward in our spiritual lives. We are called as Christians to move more deeply into our relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. We can never say..."I know all there is to know." In new ways each day the Lord is drawing us closer to Him through the power of His Spirit working within us. We realize that this is the major call of life. All the other material things really do not amount to much at all. What do you journey for in life?

Onward is a powerful message. Do we only move on from thing to thing in entertaining us during life? Do we only have a need for the next thing to scintillate our senses? Do we really know what living is all about? I hear from younger people, 'when I get enough money then I'll be able to get married.' Or an older person, 'when I retire then I'll be able to do some more for the church'. We tend to say that we'll do or be something in the future when actually doing and being that 'something' happens as we journey onward. We are always being shaped and oriented toward those things that we really

want. We should ask then the question, 'What do I really want?' And then, "How does this match what the Lord wants for my life?" "Is it only about 'me' or is it about 'Him'...or 'us'?"

In Cursillo the 4th Day is all about engaging in the life that God's Spirit is directing us to be/do. We know deeply that our lives have been bought with the blood of Christ Jesus. We belong to Him. Therefore, what we are/ do is all wrapped up in how we commune with the Lord and understand His Spirit's direction. Journey with God's Spirit in Christ and know His plan for your life. Or, do life your way and reap much less than what God intended for you to be/do. If we reap far less, does this adversely affect our present life and ultimately eternity, for us or someone else? What are the effects of living a more secular oriented life? How does that spin off into other peoples' lives? These are journey questions. If we are serious about engaging in the journey that leads us onward with Christ, then we need to assess just how much we are engaged in His Spirit in the daily decisions we make to respond to His Word, to hear His Voice, to comply with His directing,

to honor His will for our lives and those around us.

Come tonight to the teaching on spiritual journey. 7PM. I hope we will know the call to go deeper in our spiritual journey, in prayer, in purposeful decisions guided by Christ, to enter into the fullest possible fulfillment of

His Will for our lives. Let's talk about it and be honest.
