“Absolute Truth”

When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come.

--John 16:13

The Good Shepherd teaches us to obey the absolute truths given to us by God. And there are absolute truths! After Jesus had done a phenomenal miracle of casting out a demon, some in the crowd (urged on by the opposition to Jesus) shouted, “He casts out demons by Beelzebub, the ruler of the demons.” But Jesus knew their thoughts and said to them, “Any kingdom divided against itself is laid waste; and a house divided against itself falls. If Satan also is divided against himself, how will his kingdom stand?” This is an absolute truth...that any ‘kingdom’ divided against itself will fall and especially those that are invaded by demonic activity. It applies to churches too. It’s a fascinating section of Scripture that Jesus spends a good portion of teaching to explain the reality of demonic activity that can attack the faithful and often bring about their fall. Hearing such profound truth from Jesus, one of the woman bystanders there, calls out “Blessed is the womb that bore You and the breasts at which You nursed.” To which Jesus replies, “On the contrary, blessed are those who **hear the Word of God and obey it!**” (Lk 11:27-28). There is a truth connection here. The word of Jesus is the Word of God. The Word sets people free from demonic attack. As Jesus often said, “Get behind me Satan!” This means that when we use Jesus’ authority in His Name then Satan is defeated! We must realize the power we really have in the Word of God.

The former church we dealt with (TEC) became divided over the authority of Scripture. The word of the church became the word of the world. The

culture dictated how we were to receive God’s Word. But, we recognized that what Jesus spoke was the Truth and that it is to be obeyed and kept free from deceit. Our own Bishop Bill Thompson has said, “We must always keep our guard up against distortions in preaching the pure Word of God. We would err if we made the slightest departure from the truth of the Word.” How true that is! We must continue obeying God’s Word here at Grace, our diocese, and in the Anglican Church of North America. The former house was divided because truth to them was “pluriform”, according to their former presiding bishop. That meant there could be many truths, one for you, one for me, one for all the others; and if it works for them then it is good, even though at its core it was what we always believed was absolutely contrary to the will of God in His Word. So, someone could believe that Jesus really never said these words and that He really didn’t physically rise from the dead. Nonsense! This is what the enemy had hoped to do...set into the life of a church on earth the lie and that they would believe it. (Just like Fr. David said in the sermon this past Sunday) Thus, the fall of that church will be completed one day because it will fail on the denial of the power of God’s Word to say who Jesus is to a chaotic world filled with moral anarchy. Jesus clearly says, “Blessed are those who hear and obey God’s Word!” He is the epitome of the truth because He is God’s Word incarnate. He is God in the flesh! So when we obey the Word, then we’re obeying Jesus; we are obeying God and we are approved and most pleasing to God. He blesses us! Want to really be blessed? Obey the Word of the Lord! Then, Satan won’t have any way to cripple us or bring us down. I urge you to use the Word of God to defend against the enemy’s assaults on us. The Word bars the doors of our minds to the enemy’s advances. So, keep the faith, and get into the Word of God, keep it close to you, and listen to what God is saying to you, and obey. As your pastor, I am deeply committed that we obey the

Word of God...starting with me. I'm praying for you 'to read, mark, learn and inwardly digest' the Word of God. Need help...I'll be glad to...come into a small group and learn of God's Word.
